Air ticket levy ought to revert to aviation

AEROSUISSE has always made a stand against the involvement of Swiss aviation in the European emissions trading system. On 9 December, the agreement on linking the Swiss and European emissions trading systems was ratified. It comes into effect on 1 January 2020 and now also includes aviation. From 2020, the CORSIA CO2 compensation system will come into effect worldwide, which results in a double taxation for Swiss airlines – the Federal Council has always opposed this measure. AEROSUISSE is still decidedly opposed to this air ticket levy that unfortunately still can gain a political majority. Since the levy can hardly be prevented, AEROSUISSE campaigns for those taxes to be reverted to aviation in order to mitigate CO2. AEROSUISSE advocates against the private flight tax linked to the air ticket levy. Thus, promoting a comprehensive education campaign is very important.

A clear «yes» from the National Council and the Council of States to new fighter jets

After the clear approval of the planning resolution for purchasing new fighter planes for 6 billion francs on 24 September by «old» Council of States, the «new» National Council followed suit on 9 December by 124 votes against 68. AEROSUISSE is delighted about this result. President and National Councillor Thomas Hurter has actively contributed to this process. Thus, the alternative proposition put forward by the Socialist Party shortly before the debate, which budgeted one billion instead of six for new fighter planes, stood no chance.

AEROSUISSE was astonished to learn about the new starting position concerning the future of the airfield in Dübendorf, which was presented by the UVEK on 28 November. The UVEK's approach jeopardizes the planning security of the civil airfield in Dübendorf. For AEROSUISSE it is clear that new solutions must immediately be found for the UVEK's new requirements: expropriation of land and safety-related aspects. Without the civil airfield of Dübendorf the business location Zurich will lose its international connections through business aviation and leisure and sports aviation will lose an important location for their activities.

General Aviation leaves aerospace umbrella organization

The Aero Club of Switzerland, AOPA Switzerland and the Swiss Aerodromes Association have decided to withdraw from AEROSUISSE by the end of 2019. The three general aviation associations believe that, on their own, they will achieve better results in the political arena in Berne than under the umbrella of AEROSUISSE. The latter regrets the withdrawal, but the absence of contributions from general aviation is financially bearable. In future, AEROSUISSE will thus dedicatedly campaign for commercial aviation and aerospace.
